

Welcome to CiteLine, a service to facilitate the web publishing of bibliographies and citation collections as interactive exhibits and facilitate the sharing of this type of data.

Step 1: Export BibTeX

- EndNote, RefWorks, any other

Step 2: Upload file to CiteLine

- *Direct integration* from Zotero with Zotz

Step 3: Customize styling

- Themes, data filters (browse facets)

Step 4: Export

- HTML, BibTeX, RDF/XML, JSON

End-user dynamic navigation:

- Browsing by data facets (filters)
 - e.g., Pub type, author, date
- Text searching
- Sorting/grouping
- Configurable views (e.g., List, Timeline)
